Acts 16:1-3 ¹Then he came to Derbe and Lystra. And behold, a certain disciple was there, named Timothy, the son of a certain Jewish woman who believed, but his father was Greek. ¹He was well spoken of by the brethren who were at Lystra and Iconium. 'Pauli wanted to have him go on with him. And he took him and circumcised him because of the Jews who were in that region, for they all knew that his father was Greek.

- What can we determine from the phrase was Greek?
- Was Paul being hypocritical in circumcising Timothy after the council decision?
- Why was Timothy well suited to join this journey?

Acts 16:4-8 <sup>4</sup> And as they went
through the cities, they
delivered to them the decrees to
keep, which were determined by
the apostles and elders at
Jerusalem. ⁵So the churches
were strengthened in the faith,
and increased in number daily.
<sup>6</sup> Now when they had gone
through Phrygia and the region
of Galatia, they were forbidden
by the Holy Spirit to preach the
word in Asia. 7After they had
come to Mysia, they tried to go
into Bithynia, but the Spirit did
not permit them. 8So passing by
Mysia, they came down to
Troas.

- What are the decrees that were delivered?
- Does the Holy Spirit lead us today as He did Paul?

Acts 16:9-12 \*And a vision appeared to Paul in the night. A man of Macedonia stood and pleaded with him, saying, "Come over to Macedonia and help us." \*GNow after he had seen the vision, immediately we sought to go to Macedonia, concluding that the Lord had called us to preach the gospel to them. \*Therefore, sailing from Troas, we ran a straight course to Samothrace, and the next day came to Neapolis, "Pand from there to Philippi, which is the foremost city of that part of Macedonia, a colony. And we were staying in that city for some days.

- What is the significance of Macedonia?
- What is indicated using the word we in vs.10 and how did they react to the vision?
- What do we know of Philippi and what is the meaning of calling it a colony?

Acts 16:13-15 <sup>13</sup>And on the Sabbath day we went out of the city to the riverside, where prayer was customarily made; and we sat down and spoke to the women who met there. "Now a certain woman named Lydia heard us. She was a seller of purple from the city of Thyatira, who worshiped God. The Lord opened her heart to heed the things spoken by Paul. "And when she and her household were baptized, she begged us, saying, "If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come to my house and stay." So she persuaded us.

- What do we know about Lydia?
