



Acts 12:1-4 'Now about that time Herod the king stretched out his hand to harass some from the church. 'Then he killed James the brother of John with the sword. 'And because he saw that it pleased the Jews, he proceeded further to seize Peter also. Now it was during the Days of Unleavened Bread. 'Aso when he had arrested him, he put him in prison, and delivered him to four squads of soldiers to keep him, intending to bring him before the people after Passover.

- Who was James and why was he killed?

Acts 12:5-7 <sup>5</sup>Peter was therefore kept in prison, but constant prayer was offered to God for him by the church. <sup>5</sup>And when Herod was about to bring him out, that night Peter was sleeping, bound with two chains between two soldiers; and the guards before the door were keeping the prison. <sup>7</sup>Now behold, an angel of the Lord stood by *him*, and a light shone in the prison; and he struck Peter on the side and raised him up, saying, "Arise quickly!" And his chains fell off *his* hands.

- What is the meaning of constant prayer?
- What is significant about Peter sleeping in prison?

Acts 12:8-10 8Then the angel
said to him, "Gird yourself
and tie on your sandals"; and
so he did. And he said to him,
"Put on your garment and
follow me." 9So he went out
and followed him, and did not
know that what was done by
the angel was real, but
thought he was seeing a
vision. 10When they were past
the first and the second
guard posts, they came to the
iron gate that leads to the
city, which opened to them of
its own accord; and they
went out and went down one
street, and immediately the
angel departed from him.

Why did the angel not continue on with Peter?

Why was Peter delivered and James not?

Acts 12:11-15 <sup>11</sup>And when Peter had come to himself, he said, "Now I know for certain that the Lord has sent His angel, and has delivered me from the hand of Herod and from all the expectation of the Jewish people." <sup>12</sup>So, when he had considered this, he came to the house of Mary, the mother of John whose surname was Mark, where many were gathered together praying. <sup>13</sup>And as Peter knocked at the door of the gate, a girl named Rhoda came to answer. <sup>13</sup>When she recognized Peter's voice, because of her gladness she did not open the gate, but ran in and announced that Peter stood before the gate. <sup>13</sup>But they said to her, "You are beside yourself!" Yet she kept insisting that it was so. So they said, "It is his angel."

Why choose to go to the house of Mary instead of fleeing the city?

Acts 12:16-19 <sup>16</sup>Now Peter continued knocking; and when they opened the door and saw him, they were astonished.

"But motioning to them with his hand to keep silent, he declared to them how the Lord had brought him out of the prison. And he said, "Go, tell these things to James and to the brethren." And he departed and went to another place. <sup>16</sup>Then, as soon as it was day, there was no small stir among the soldiers about what had become of Peter. "But when Herod had searched for him and not found him, he examined the guards and commanded that they should be put to death. And he went down from Judea to Caesarea, and stayed there.

- Why are we not told where Peter went when he left Jerusalem?
- Why sentence the guards to death?
- Is it possible that Peter did not know that James had been martyred?

Acts 12:20-23 <sup>20</sup>Now Herod had been very angry with the people of Tyre and Sidon; but they came to him with one accord, and having made Blastus the king's personal aide their friend, they asked for peace, because their country was supplied with food by the king's country. <sup>21</sup>So on a set day Herod, arrayed in royal apparel, sat on his throne and gave an oration to them. <sup>22</sup>And the people kept shouting, "The voice of a god and not of a man!" <sup>23</sup>Then immediately an angel of the Lord struck him, because he did not give glory to God. And he was eaten by worms and died.

- Why did the people of Tyre and Sidon visit Herod?
- What was the set day?
- Why did Herod die such a gruesome death?
