Matthew 6:1-4 "Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven. 2 "Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. 3 But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, 4so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

What is the definition of hypocrisy and why is the church accused of being full of them?

Did Jesus suggest we give to the poor or command us to?

Do we lose God's reward if someone praises us for something?

What does it mean to not let the left hand know what the right is doing?

OT Giving

- Tithe 10% of income
- Freewill giving above and beyond 10% for specific purposes such as building the temple
- Alms giving to the poor

Eight Principals of OT/NT Giving:

- Giving is investing with God and puts us into the cycle of blessings
- Giving is to be sacrificial
- · Giving is not related to what we have
- Giving correlates with Spiritual riches
- Giving is to be purposefully determined
- Giving is to be in response to need
- Giving demonstrates love and not the lawGiving is to be generous

Matthew 6:5-8 ⁵ "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ⁶ But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ⁷ "And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. ⁸ Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.
